

COMPETITIVE DRIVE AWARDS PROGRAM RULES

The PShR celebrates the achievement of both the Horse and the Driver when they compete in **COMPETITIVE DRIVE** events. To be eligible, the horse must be registered with the PShR and the Owner and Rider must have paid membership dues to the PShR for the competition year. A Nomination Form for each horse/driver team must be submitted with appropriate fees postmarked at least 7 days prior to their first drive in order for scores to count. If the horse competes in more than one discipline, an additional fee must be paid for each discipline (e.g., a horse competing in Competitive Drive and Endurance would have to be nominated for both disciplines).

The competition year will be from December 1 to November 30th of the following year. All results must be reported to the Awards Chair by December 10th and be accompanied by placing/results from an official source of a regional or national organization (e.g., results posted on the internet, a competition points sheet signed by the event manager, etc.). The horse/rider team must complete a minimum of two drives to be eligible for points in the PShR Awards Program.

I. Competitive Drive:

- a. Competitive Driving differs from endurance riding since competitive events have several different sanctioning organizations across the USA.
- b. Only rides sanctioned by a regional or national organization will count toward PShR Competitive Drive Awards. The horse/driver team must complete two drives.

Competitive Drive Awards

- 1. PShR Champion and Reserve Champion Competitive Drive Horse & Senior Driver will be awarded at the end of each year. Additional qualifying horse/driver teams will receive an Honorable Mention.
- 2. PShR Champion and Reserve Champion Competitive Drive Horse & Junior Driver will be awarded at the end of each year. A Junior Rider is anyone under the age of 18 by December 1st of the competition year. Additional qualifying horse/driver teams will receive an Honorable Mention.
- c. Competitive NOVICE drives will be recognized.
- d. Mileage must be a multiple of five (5), ending in zero (0) or five (5), whichever is the nearest whole number to the actual ride mileage. (example: 22.4 miles = 20 miles, 22.5 miles = 25 miles)
- e. More than one driver can drive the same horse for points with each horse/driver team accumulating separate points toward awards.

f. Points will be awarded for a Senior and Junior Division as per the Competitive Points Table (II).

Examples of formula:

- 1. Driver places 2nd (20 points) on a 12.5-mile novice ride (6.25 points). Total of 26.25 points.
- 2. Driver places 3rd (15 points) on a 50 mile (25 point) Regional ride (13 points). Total of 53 points.
