

DRESSAGE AWARDS PROGRAM RULES

The PShR celebrates the achievement of both the Horse and the Rider when they compete in **DRESSAGE** events. To be eligible to receive year end awards the horse must be registered with the Performance Shagya-Arabian Registry. Additionally, Rider and Owner must have paid membership dues to the PShR for the competition year.

The competition year is from December 1 to November 30th of the following year (year used to identify the period of competition). All nominations, with appropriate fees, must be sent to the PShR Treasurer by December 10th. Payment for nominations can be made either through check or by PayPal to performanceshagya@gmail.com . All results must be reported to the Awards Chair by December 10th and be accompanied by placing/results from an official source of a regional or national organization (e.g., results posted on the internet, a competition points sheet signed by the event manager, etc.). The horse/rider team must complete a minimum of two events to be eligible for points in the PShR Awards Program.

The PShR participates in the USDF All-Breeds Awards Program and will recognize the following: Champion, Reserve Champion and Third Place in the Open and Adult Amateur Divisions at all levels of Dressage (Introductory through Grand Prix). Additionally, for any horse competing in the USDF All-Breeds Awards Program, the "*Budapest Memorial Award," donated by WineGlass Farm, is awarded annually to the high scoring PShR registered horse at each level in open or adult amateur competition.

PShR awards are designed to reward horses that consistently earn good scores, regardless of where they place in a class. One CHAMPION and one RESERVE CHAMPION will be named for each division at each level of competition, Introductory through FEI. One CHAMPION and one RESERVE CHAMPION will be given for Musical Freestyle for First through FEI levels combined.

I. Dressage Awards

- Divisions include Junior, Adult Amateur and Open.
 - A Junior is anyone that has not reached his/her 18th birthday by December 1st of the competition vear.
 - Adult Amateurs are classified as anyone age 18 and above, who is not involved in any professional activities (see USEF rules for amateur status).
- Levels are Introductory through Grand Prix and Musical Freestyle.

II. Qualification For Dressage Awards Program

- The Horse and Rider combination must have two qualifying scores from two different judges from two different shows. NOTE: When both qualifying scores were earned at recognized schooling shows, the scores must be from two different shows.
- Scores must be a minimum of 60% at Introductory 4th level and a minimum of 58% at PSG and above. Scores must be from USEF, FEI or USDF tests. The scores will be averaged.
- The rider must send to the Award Chairperson either the horse's USDF Score Sheet with their two chosen scores highlighted or a "GOOD QUALITY" photocopy of the original test for each qualifying score. Photocopy must clearly state the show name, horse and rider, class, date, judge, score and judge's signature. Photocopy does not have to include individual movement scores and comments.
