

# PSHR SUMMARY CHART FOR SHAGYA SHORTHORSES



ıR Breeding Guidelines - ZBO \*\*\* This is not an ISG Book.

Refer to the Performance Shagya-Arabian Registry Breeding Guidelines for complete details.

#### Shagya Sporthorse Book I (Book I)

- 1 Horses must have seven (7) or more registered ISG Shagya-Arabians in the 4th generation
  - 1.1 Horses must be 25% Shagya-Arabian in pedigree
  - 1.2 One parent must be from Stallion Book I or II/Mare Book I or II
  - 1.3 One parent may be Grade or any breed other then purebred Arabian
- 2 Horses must receive a minimum average Evaluation score of seven (7) or higher at an ISG affiliated Evaluation.
- 3 Upon Evaluation and veterinary exam Horses will be temporarily placed in Shagya Sporthorse Book I. Conditions for permanent entry must be completed to retain placement in the Shagya Sporthorse Book I. There is not an age limit on the performance test completion date.
- 4. Horses must be performance tested to maintain permanent placement in Shagya Sporthorse Book I. A Horse must complete his performance testing and comply with the following:
  - 4.2 A Horse must complete his performance criteria within three years of Evaluation.
  - 4.3 The PShR may extend the time frame for a Horse to complete his performance testing in special circumstances up to a maximum of 18 months.
  - 4.4 Injured or Horses unable to compete due to age may apply to the PShR to be released from this rule to remain in Shagya Sporthorse Book I.
  - 4.5 Horses not completing the performance testing will be removed from the Shagya Sporthorse Book I and placed in Shagya Sporthorse Book II.

## Shagya Sporthorse Book I Appendix (Book IA)

1. Horses with less than seven (7) Shagya-Arabians in the 4th generation but meet the remaining requirements as Book I are eligible for Book IA.

### Shagya Sporthorse Book II (Book II)

- 1. Horses must have seven (7) or more registered ISG Shagya-Arabians in the 4th generation.
  - 1.1 Horses must be 25% Shagya-Arabian in pedigree
  - 1.2 One parent must be from Stallion Book I or II/Mare Book I or II
  - 1.3 One parent may be Grade or any breed other then purebred Arabian
- 2. The following points will place a Shagya Sporthorse Book I Horse into Shagya Sporthorse Book II:
  - 2.1 An average Evaluation score less than seven (7) at an ISG affiliated Evaluation
  - 2.2 And/or has not completed a Horse Performance Test within three years of his Evaluation date

#### Shagya Sporthorse Book Appendix (Book IIA)

1. Horses with less than seven (7) Shagya-Arabians in the 4th generation but meet the remaining requirements as Book II are eligible for Book IIA.

#### Mandatory Requirements For All Horses Seeking PShR Licensing:

- 1. Inspected Mares and Horses will be inspected and/or evaluated per ISG standards for breeding approval. Horses are to be shown on the triangle and at liberty both directions of the ring.
- 2. Free Jumping All horses must complete a free jumping course at a recognized PShR Evaluation site.
- 3. Interior/Temperament Test -All horses will be required to complete an Interior Test as per the ZSAA (Zuchtverband fur Sportpferde arabischer AbstammungeV) criteria at a recognized PShR Evaluation.
- 4. Veterinary Examination All horses nominated for Licensing will stand for a veterinary examination at a recognized PShR Evaluation site. The exam will be conducted by a licensed veterinarian and will include but is not limited to a flexion test and trot out on a hard surface. An exam for anomalies, heart defects, faulty bite or teeth, retained or immature testicles, deficiencies or other conditions indicating genetic predisposition will be conducted per the RZBO guidelines.
- 6. Rideability Horses four (4) years of age or older will be ridden by a rider of the owner's choice and by a test rider selected by the PShR per the criteria at an approved PShR Evaluation.

## **Shagya Sporthorse Performance Test**

Horses must complete the mandatory requirements and one of the following performance division. Performance may be started before the required Shagya-Arabian Evaluation and Mandatory Requirements.

Horses must complete one of the following to be recognized as a PShR Elite Horse.

**Jumping:** Placed at least five (5) times in the upper 25% of a class at a level comparable to the RZBO requirement of ""L-level" of 1 meter 20. Competitions must be recognized by the USEF.

**Elite Jumping**: Placed at least ten (10) times in the upper 25% of a class at a level comparable to the RZBO requirement of "M level" of 1 meter 30+ or higher. Competitions must be recognized by the USEF.

**OR Dressage:** Receive the USDF All-Breed award at First Level.

**OR Elite Dressage**: Received the USDF All-Breed award at Third Level or higher.

**OR 3-Day Eventing:** Placed at least five (5) time in the upper 25% of a class at a level comparable to the RZBO requirement "Llevel" of 1 meter 20. Competition must be recognized by the USEF.

**OR Elite 3-Day Eventing:** Placed at least ten (10) times in the upper 25% of a class at a level comparable to the RZBO requirement "M level" of 1 meter 30+ or higher. Competitions must be recognized by the USEF.

**OR Endurance:** Obtain 73 points as per the VZAP (Verband der Zuechter des Arabischen Pferdes eV) Pace Criteria. This must include the completion of two 50-mile rides. Points are calculated as the distance in miles divided by the completion time.

**OR Elite Endurance**: Obtain 81 points as per the VZAP (Verband der Zuchter des Arabischen Pferdes eV) Pace Criteria. This must include the completion of two 50-mile rides. Points are calculated as the distance in miles divided by the completion time.

OR Distance Riding - Two Options: 1 )Complete 1000 miles (may be a combination of competitive and/or endurance and/or LD) in sanctioned organizations. OR 2) Complete 500 miles and place in the top ten in an AHA National Competitive, AHA National Endurance, or AERC National Championship Ride.

**OR Elite Distance Riding - Two options:** 1) Complete 2000 miles (may be a combination of competitive and/or endurance and/or LD) in sanctioned organizations. **OR** 2) Complete 1000 miles and place in the top ten in an AHA National Competitive, AHA National Endurance, or AERC National Championship Ride.

OR Horse Testing Trials: Horses may complete a 30-day Horse testing conducted by the ISR (International Sporthorse Registry) or a test similar in criteria. Horses must score a minimum of 75% or higher.

**OR Elite Horse Testing Trials:** Horses may complete a 100-day Horse testing conducted by the ISR (International Sporthorse Registry) or a test similar in criteria. Horses must score a minimum of 75% or higher.

**OR Racing:** As per the RZBO guidelines, a flat race test with a GAG\* of at least 58 kg (127.6 lbs).

and other riding disciplines can be submitted to the PShR for consideration.

OR Other Disciplines: Western Riding, Reining, Hunter, Driving OR Other Disciplines for Elite Placing: Western Riding, Reining, Hunter, Driving and other riding disciplines can be submitted to the PShR for consideration.

#### **Assessment Team**

The Evaluation Commission (Judges) will be carried out by members based on their specialized qualifications and in good standing with the ISG. An ideal panel would include:

- 1) Judge approved by the ISG,
- 2) A neutral Shagya-Arabian expert specializing in performance,
- 3) An experienced Shagya-Arabian breeder,
- 4) A breeding manager of a large scale production,
- 5) Veterinarian.
