As part of our process to align the PShR with the ISG and other ISG members, the PShR BOD approved the policies PShR Policy for the Use of Frozen Semen and PShR Policy for the Use of Frozen Semen or Embryo Transfer to facilitate the entry of stallions or mares into the PShR Studbook. As an ISG member registry, an association cannot deny the entry of a horse from another ISG member's studbook. However, an ISG member registry can set specific requirements and regulations as to how a horse is entered into their respective studbooks as a breeding animal. A re-inspection may be required or additional performance testing for example by the accepting ISG member registry.

The PShR wants to make the process obtainable

for all ISG horses that have been inspected and performance tested. The PShR also offers options for the mare owner to make the process as easy as possible with respect to the standards of fellow member criteria.

Naturally we encourage all Shagya-Arabian horses to complete the PShR performance criteria.

PShR horses consistently prove they are the best of the best.

The complete PShR Policies are posted on the website: www.performanceshagya-registry.org. The PShR welcomes all stallions and we look forward to additional breeding choices for the PShR mare owners.

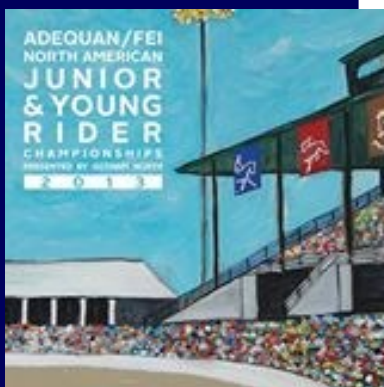
breeding schedule. In addition, *Budapest also completed endurance miles making him one of the early performance tested stallions in North America.

In July, 2012, the Performance Shagya-Arabian Registry (PShR) was accepted as a member of the International Shagya Araber Gesellschaft (ISG). As our celebration came to an end, we looked back on the efforts that had brought us so far, and realized that the real work had just begun! We were committed to holding an inspection and performance testing that would not only determine Shagya-Arabian breeding stock, it would also showcase the Shagya-Arabian geldings and Shagya sport horses in North America and Canada. In addition, this venue would be open to

all Shagya-Arabians and Shagya sport horses, including those horses not registered with PShR.

Following the ISG-approved PShR ZBO (or breeding guidelines), the committee started planning the phases of the inspection which included the following areas:

Veterinary examination, Inspection/Evaluation, Interior Test, Rideability evaluation, and Free Jumping test.

An inspection of this format had never been held in North America for Shagya-Arabians. The PShR uses a performance based inspection to determine breeding stock

and to recognize and appreciate the progeny resulting from performance breeding. Previously, breeding criteria in the US and Canada was based on conformation only. Judges would arrive at the inspection site, view and score the horses for conformation and gaits, and approve

(or disapprove) the horses for breeding. The Performance Shagya-Arabian Registry has aligned with the ISG and uses a "European style" inspection and licensing system comprised of multiple tests and standards. The mandatory requirements for breeding animals includes the

presentation of the horse in-hand, mandatory SCID test for all purebred Arabians seeking Shagya-Arabian breeding

1 - Secretary Bonnie Burnett submitted the election report.

Anke Brander, Linda Rudolphi & Holly Kemmis were elected to the PShR Board of Directors.

Interim President Brander was disappointed at the voter turnout - being able to vote for directors is an important function of the membership. At this time we have 34 members. Discussion to motivate the PShR members included making a designated member in every region responsible for contacting members and getting feedback.

2-Treasure Holly Kemmis submitted a Treasury report -

The checking account balance is \$1365.12.

The only recent expenditure was the reimbursement of Holly Kemmis for the purchase and mailing of the 2012 End of Year awards. The awards program generated \$410 in nominations to be used for awards - the total award expenditure was \$390.77. Awards included dressage pads, halters, and other items of the winner's choice.

At this time the 2013 PShR awards nominations have generated a \$320 budget - as new horses nominate that budget will change accordingly. All nominations go towards the award budget. Awards Chairperson Becky McCarty was on the call - she had a good suggestion for the nomination form next year - you would like to clarify that all competition results should be sent to her within 30 days of the competition. This rule has not been enforced in the past. Becky pointed out this makes the calculating of points much easier. This was also a concern of the past Award Chair Lisa Fiano.

4 - ISG meeting report - Linda Rudolphi

Olivia and Linda Rudolphi were the 2013 delegates to the meeting in Marbach, Germany.

The present worldwide count of ISG registered Shagya-Arabians of

breeding age is over 10,000 horses.

The ISG stressed the term "Shagya-Arabian" is a copyright term and may not be used by individuals or organizations other than members of the ISG. Non-ISG members may not issue Shagya-Arabian registration certificates or passports.

Dr. Huber, an ISG board member, reported on the PShR inspection. He congratulated the PShR for conducting a true European style inspection. He commented that the free jumping was well set up and was an excellent test for the horses. Walter Tautermann was also acknowledged for donat-

ing his Shagya branding irons to the PShR.

ISG committee reports included:

Use of the UELN (Universal Equine Lifetime Number) database for a permanent number for each Shagya-Arabian. Microchips tend to fail or migrate.

Horses tested for SCID & CA should be listed. Peter Zechner also encouraged the listing of LFS.

The training of judges was discussed along with the correct presentation of horses for judging. The triangle used by the PShR was the recommended style.

Peter Zechner is concerned about the foot quality and shoeing of presented horses - he suggested stallions under the age of 4 being barefoot when showing for the European Championship.

Svetlo Kashchiev questioned the description of the Shagya-Arabian in the judging guidelines - there is a discrepancy in the frame description - square vs. rectangle. The

ideal is rectangle and the corrections should be made to the text.

A learner judge training program is scheduled for the 2014 meeting in Babolna.

The advertising and promotion goals that have been achieved by the committee include: new ISG breed pamphlet, ISG Shagya brand jewelry and the new website is under construction.

The European Shagya-Arabian Championship followed the two days after the meeting. The style of horse presentation (typical purebred Arabian vs. sporthorse) brought about some discussion by those present.

5. Marketing/ Website/ Advertisement for 2013-14

Anke mentioned she has a good friend familiar with fund raising and marketing who may be interested in helping the PShR.

visualize the positive influence the Shagya-Arabian has on other breeds. And our beloved Shagya-Arabian geldings, the true ambassadors of our breed, stole the show. They put their hearts into the jumping (at 39" some were not challenged), showed their willingness to work for various riders, and exhibited confidence going through the Interior test.

This was an historical step for the Shagya-Arabians in the United States and Canada. The PShR aligned our

approval of breeding with the ISG performance standards used throughout history to develop this outstanding breed and also to make it a valuable outcross for other sport horse breeds. Along with historical standards, the PShR is looking to the future and incorporating modern concepts of breeding selec-

tion with which includes the Interior test and the performance testing of mares. When people talk of the Shagya-Arabian in North America as a riding horse or as an "improver" outcross, we are sure they will give special recognition to the truly Performance Tested Shagya-Arabians of the PShR.
