What a success!!! The Performance Shagya-Arabian Registry congratulates all of the horses and riders that participated in the first Shagya- Arabian Distance Horse National Championship held in conjunction with the



Arabian Horse Association. October 26 – Oct 27, 2018 over 100 horses and riders came from all around the country to compete and have fun at the Spook Run ride in Henryville, Indiana.

To be eligible to compete in the 50-mile Championship, Shagya-Arabians had to be at least 6 years of age. Both horse and rider must have successfully completed a minimum of 200 lifetime miles including at least two AERC endurance rides of 50 or more miles. To compete in the 100-mile championship the horse had to be at least 7 years old and both the horse and rider must have successfully completed a minimum of 300 lifetime



miles. All of the Shagya-Arabian competitors far exceeded these criteria.
