PShR Breeding Book Guideline Changes

Over the last year and a half the PShR Board of Directors has been working on ways to grow PShR and the Shagya-Arabian population in the United States while maintaining the quality and integrity of the breed. It has been decided one thing PShR could do to make registering horses easier would be to make some changes to the PShR breeding guidelines and breeding books. After significant time was spent deliberating, these changes are the results:

Stallions

All previous breeding guidelines established for stallions through the ISG remain congruent with the PShR breeding book guidelines. Performance testing is still required for breeding book placement.

Annual Awards 2024

Don't forget to submit your nominations, fees and event results by December 10th to qualify for the PShR Annual Awards program! To be eligible the nominated horse must be registered with PShR and the rider and owner must have paid membership dues to PShR for the competition year. Mares and Geldings

All performance testing requirements have been removed for book placement. Mares and geldings will be categorized into the correct books based on the number of Shagya-Arabians in the 4th generation, inspection scores, and PShR breeding approval of sire and dam.

Sporthorses

The Sporthorse books are not recognized by ISG and remain solely PShR books. All performance testing requirements have been removed for book placement. To be considered eligible for the Sporthorse book there must be at least 1 Shagya-Arabian in the 4th generation registered with the ISG or ISG affiliate group. Inspection scores will also help place sporthorses into the correct books.

PShR plans to reclassify all the current horses within the registry based on the changes noted above.

The PShR Board of Directors hopes these changes will encourage further breeding and registration of Shagya-Arabians within the United States. We hope to have these updates posted soon on our website, feel free to review them at: performanceshagyaregistry.org.

WineGlass Dezaley (Piper) - SAR Tiki Rock On x WineGlass Dora

I purchased Piper as a weanling from Linda Rudolphi in the fall of 2020. That summer I spent a lot of time, and Covid stimulus check money, attempting to get my leased mare bred to SAR Tiki Rock On (Rock). I spoke with Linda earlier in the year as she was very familiar with Rock and his owners as she had helped to get him approved for Shagya breeding. After my mare did not settle, I reached out to Linda to see if she had any interest in selling any of her 2020 Rock foals. She sent me pictures and video of Piper and within a month she was mine and moved to Minnesota! The first thing that impressed me was that she jumped right on the trailer at Linda's, never made a peep on her 12 hour trip home, and traveled like a seasoned veteran.





As Piper grew up so did her personality. She quickly adopted the mare mentality - she had an opinion on everything and she made sure I knew about it. I have to admit, it is why I personally prefer a mare, the sass keeps me on my toes! Piper has always been willing to learn, even as a youngster, and I am grateful that we have had so much time to bond. Having those baby years allowed me to get to know her and we developed a mutual trust and respect for one another.

After completing hours of groundwork, grooming, and teaching her that "yes you do always have to listen" - it was time to start some official saddle training last winter. Piper did voice her opinion that she would be very happy continuing to be a pasture pet however I think she is starting to come around! By April we had our first ride and two weeks later we were venturing out for some short trail rides thanks to the mild winter.





Piper and I continue to spend time on trail working on water crossings, walking past scary obstacles, keeping her mare opinions to herself and realizing that maybe working to earn her keep could be enjoyable! I continue to be pleased that she is levelheaded, not spooky and has pretty darn good self preservation. Linda had a wonderful breeding program for Shagya-Arabians and I feel lucky to have a WineGlass bred horse. I'm looking forward to many more adventures with Piper and this has been a great introduction for me into the Shagya-Arabian breed!
